## Encanto – The Enchanted Village of Mi Pueblo 30 years of Magic - Treinta Años Mágicos

30th Mi Pueblo

June 20 - 24, 2022

It is time for Campers, Teens and ALL volunteers and instructors to register for our 30<sup>th</sup> Mi Pueblo Day Camp which will be held the week of **June 20 to 24, 2022,** at Forest Hill Church in Cleveland Heights.

The Camp hours will be 9:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Monday-Thursday, with early release on Friday. The annual Fiesta will be a special occasion on Friday, June 24th from 6:30-10 pm at Forest Hill Church.

This year's Camp Theme, naturally, is "Encanto-The Enchanted Village of Mi Pueblo."

Appropriately, for our big 30th Anniversary celebrate the magic starting on the

**Monday** of Camp with a look into the Latin American home and traditions.

We will then progress thru the week meeting the characters from the film Encanto, exploring adventures in nature, like the beautiful world of Encanto, celebrating the powers and talents of our Campers as they explore their own magic, and finally wondering in our own enchanted village of *Mi Pueblo*.

All campers, teen and young adult volunteers, and parent and other adult volunteers, including Teachers, MUST be registered for Camp! Get started by filling out the forms sent with this La Prensa, including the Camper/Teen/Volunteer/Teacher Registration Form, and the Camper/Teen/Volunteer/Teacher Information Form.

Camp fees are the same as last year, with the addition of the Teen Program fee, and new modest fees for adult volunteers, and for the Fiesta. For the Volunteer discount a parent must volunteer all 5 days at Camp. Scholarships are available, depending on need. Mi Pueblo wants everyone to attend and no one to be excluded due to cost.

The fees for Camp include a T-shirt, lunch, and snack each day, take home gifts, classes and special events each day. Note, that once you register for Camp, you will receive a mailing in June with all the key information you will need for Camp.

As you fill out the forms, please consider volunteering to help plan and organize the Camp. We really need help with a new Teen Program and with a very special Fiesta celebration. Planning is going on now — so there are ways you can help before Camp.

Help is needed on Friday, June 17<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm to load up the truck that carries our

Camp supplies from the Palus home in Parma to the Church.

Also, we need you to help set up Camp on Saturday, June 18, from 9 am to 12 noon, and Sunday, June 19, from 12 noon to 3 pm.

On **Sunday, June 19th**, at 6 pm, the evening before Camp, we will have our annual volunteer and Camp family get together (and pizza party) at Embassy Suites Hotel in Beachwood.

There are many ways to help -donations of raffle/auction items,
baking desserts, setting-up/cleaning up, and money donations - are all
vital to make the Camp special and
allow everyone to participate.

# Key Facts About Mi Pueblo Culture Camp '22

<u>Camp Location</u>: Forest Hill Presbyterian Church, 3031 Monticello Blvd. (corner of Monticello Blvd. and Lee Rd.), Cleveland Hts., OH (Mi Pueblo has rented the Church's facilities for 28 years.)

Dates: Monday through Friday, June 20 - 24, 2022.

Times: 9:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. (early dismissal on Friday TBA)

Friday Night Fiesta: June 20th - 6:30 - 10 p.m. at Forest Hill Church.

- Ages: Camp classes are offered for: (1) children entering Pre-school/Kindergarten in the Fall of 2022 through those entering 6th grade, (2) Senior Campers who are entering 7th and 8th grade, and (3) those entering the 9th grade in the Fall of 2022 (who are called Volunteers in Training (VITs).)
- <u>Child Care</u>: Child care is being provided this year. Children 2 and 3 years of age and older may participate either with child care or in the <u>Pre-K/Kindergarten</u> Class as a regular Camper if the child is ready for a schedule of classes and activities. Staff will reach out to all parents of these children to discuss the options.
- <u>Fees:</u> Campers (including Senior Campers) \$220/child. Campers of parent volunteers \$180/child (volunteers must hold significant pre-Camp position or work all 5 days at camp). Campers of members of Planning Committee \$140/child. Volunteers-in-Training (entering 9th grade) \$150. Teens in the Teen Program (See below) \$100. Adult Volunteers \$50 if no Camper registered/\$25 if 1 or more Camper registered. Fiesta \$20 each adult attendee (18 and over); Payment of Camp fee gives adults/teens one free ticket for each fee paid.
- Scholarships: Concern for Children does not want to have any child miss the opportunity to attend camp. Therefore, need-based scholarships are available. To apply, send a written request to Bill Gruber, 2714 Leighton Road, Shaker Heights, OH 44120 or gruberwl@aol.com.
- Payment of Fees: FEES MUST BE PAID BY JUNE 15th, BUT PLEASE SEND IN REGISTRATION FORM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. REGISTRATION FORMS SUBMITTED AFTER MAY 31st REQUIRE A \$20 LATE FEE.
- Registration: You can register by mailing or emailing in your registration forms, and send a check or pay at Mi PuebloCamp.org. You will receive more Camp details in early June. Refunds of 100% will be made no later than May 31st, 50% no later than June 15th, 25% no later than June 20th. NO CAMPER REGISTRATIONS ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 7th. FORMS SUBMITTED AFTER MAY 31st REQUIRE A LATE FEE OF \$20. PAYMENT MAY BE MADE BY JUNE 15th.
- NEW Teen Program: Mi Pueblo is excited to announce a new teen program for 2022!! The goal of the program is to balance the work and fun of Camp. The Teen Program will consist of: 1. Volunteering, 2. Organized activities, and 3. Socializing. There will be cooking classes, team building games, dance troupe, forums led by alumni and special guests, and much more. It'll be a memorable week and Mi Pueblo looks forward to your teen's participation in the program. Those teens entering 10th grade (called Interns) will automatically be enrolled in this new program. Teens entering 11th grade and 12th grade and those who graduated this year (2022) have the choice to enroll in the teen program or to instead work as full-time volunteers in a homeroom or class. To cover the costs of this program, we are bringing back the Camp teen fee of \$100 for those entering 10th grade and those (11th, 12th, and graduates) who choose to enroll instead of volunteering full-time. For teens who register to volunteer full-time, there is an adult/teen volunteer fee of \$50. costs for food, supplies and other needs for Camp, we have instituted a new modest fee for all volunteers at Camp. There is also a small fee for all adults attending the Fiesta---though payment of a Camp fee gives adults, and teens 18 and over, one free ticket for each fee paid.

The Camp fees are never sufficient to pay all the expenses of Camp, so we depend upon donations and sales of raffle tickets, and bids on the silent auction, at the Fiesta in order to provide a fun, exciting, educational, authentic and safe Camp experience. *Mi Pueblo* provides scholarships for families (and for any fees) to ensure that no one is ever turned away for lack of funds.

We are also an all-volunteer Camp, and so lots of helpers are needed – please consider volunteering---even if you can't attend during the week of Camp. I hope to see you soon! Bill

Concern for Children, Inc. is the non-profit parent organization of Mi Pueblo Camp. CFC has helped support the Camp since its start. #### Volunteers New to Mi Pueblo

In addition, <u>all</u> volunteers new to Mi Pueblo must complete a 4-hour training program offered during Camp week. Once a new volunteer has submitted their volunteer registration form, they will receive an email on the next steps.

The Committee is continuing its work --- if you are willing to volunteer, contact Hope Carroll <a href="https://hopecarrollhope@gmail.com">hopecarrollhope@gmail.com</a>. With enrollment in the younger Camp grades falling, fewer adoptees coming into the US from Latin America, and Mi Pueblo leadership aging and their children moving on, the Planning Committee believes the Camp needs to take a serious look at the future of Mi Pueblo, with the goal of keeping the Camp going and keeping it strong.

The Future Camp Committee is chaired by Hope Carroll, and other members are Becky Parr, Carolyn Holland, and Bill Gruber.

The Committee is considering recommendations regarding how Camp is structured, whether it remains a week-long Camp or becomes a long weekend, whether more of the activities become family activities, and how we can keep the teens active and interested.

We also need to develop job descriptions and consider how to divide up jobs (including for in-town and out of town volunteers). Succession planning for leadership roles is critical as the current leaders age and/or their children are no longer involved with Camp. Our main goal is to engage former Campers and other young adult Latinos to take over key positions at Camp.
