The History of Mesoamerica - Ancient Empires and Indigenous Legends

31st Mi Pueblo

June 19 - 23, 2023

It is time for Campers, Teens and ALL volunteers and instructors to register for our 31st Mi Pueblo Day Camp which will be held the week of June 19 to 23, 2023, at Forest Hill Church in Cleveland Heights.

The Camp hours will be 9:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Monday-Thursday, with early release on Friday. The annual Fiesta will be held on Friday, June 23rd from 6:30-10 pm at Forest Hill Church.

This year's Camp Theme, is The History of Mesoamerica - Ancient Empires and Indigenous Legends,

La Historia de MesoAmerica -Civilizaciones Antiguas v

Levendas Indigenas.

We will enter the undersea ancient world of Talokan (from the film Black Panther 2), and go back in time to explore the ancient peoples of Central America, whose living relatives call Central America home today.

We begin on Monday with our annual opening ceremony, and a celebration of the importance of water for life. On Tuesday we look to the stars and Sun for guidance. Wednesday is a celebration of the sustenance food brings, especially at a Camp picnic in the park. On Thursday we learn of the influences of the ancient world on us today. And on Friday we honor the ancient peoples, ending in the annual Fiesta on Friday evening..

All campers, teen and young adult volunteers, and parent and other adult volunteers, including Teachers, MUST be registered for Camp! Get started by filling out the forms sent with this La Prensa, Camper/Teen/ including the Volunteer/Teacher Registration Form, and the Camper/Teen/ Volunteer/Teacher Information Form.

Camp fees are the same as last year, except for the elimination of the

Reduced fee for 9th graders. The fees for Camp include a T-shirt, lunch, and snack each day, take home gifts, classes and special events each day. Note, that once you register for Camp, you will receive a mailing in June with all the key information you will need for Camp.

Mi Pueblo Contest!!

To get everyone thinking about our 31st Camp theme, Mi Pueblo is again having a contest. This year we will celebrate ""The History of Mesoamerica - Ancient Empires and Indigenous Legends." We will explore the ancient civilizations of Central America and delve into the world of Talokan (Black Panther 2).

Key Facts About Mi Pueblo Culture Camp '23

<u>Camp Location</u>: Forest Hill Presbyterian Church, 3031 Monticello Blvd. (corner of Monticello Blvd. and Lee Rd.), Cleveland Hts., OH (Mi Pueblo has rented the Church's facilities for 31 years.)

Dates: Monday through Friday, June 19 - 23, 2023.

Times: 9:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. (early dismissal on Friday TBA)

Friday Night Fiesta: June 23rd - 6:30 - 10 p.m. at Forest Hill Church.

Ages: Camp classes are offered for: (1) children entering Pre-school/Kindergarten in the Fall of 2023 through those entering 7th grade, and (2) Senior Campers who are entering 8th and 9th grade.

Child Care: Child care may be provided for a volunteer's child(ren) up to 2.5 years of age.

Pre-K: Children 2.5 years to 4 years may participate in the **Pre-K** Class as a regular Camper if the child is ready for a half day schedule of classes and activities and half day of play time. Staff will reach out to parents of these children to discuss the options.

<u>Fees:</u> Campers (including Senior Campers) - \$220/child. Campers of parent volunteers - \$180/child (volunteers must hold significant pre-Camp position or work all 5 days at camp). Campers of members of Planning Committee - \$140/child. Teens in the Teen Program (See below) - \$100. Adult Volunteers \$50 if no Camper/Teen registered/\$25 if 1 or more Camper/Teen registered. Note: There is no longer a reduced fee for 9th graders.

Scholarships: Concern for Children does not want to have any child miss the opportunity to attend camp. Therefore, need-based scholarships are available. To apply, send a written request to Bill Gruber, 2714 Leighton Road, Shaker Heights, OH 44120 or gruberwl@aol.com.

Payment of Fees: FEES MUST BE PAID BY JUNE 15th, BUT PLEASE SEND IN REGISTRATION FORM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. REGISTRATION FORMS SUBMITTED AFTER MAY 31st REQUIRE A \$20 LATE FEE.

Registration: You can register by mailing or emailing in your registration forms, and send a check or pay at Mi PuebloCamp.org. You will receive more Camp details in early June. Refunds of 100% will be made no later than May 31st, 50% no later than June 15th, 25% no later than June 20th. NO CAMPER REGISTRATIONS ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 7th. FORMS SUBMITTED AFTER MAY 31st REQUIRE A LATE FEE OF \$20. PAYMENT MAY BE MADE BY JUNE 15th.

Teen Program: The goal of the program, in its 2nd year, is to balance the work and fun of Camp. The Teen Program will consist of: 1. Volunteering, 2. Organized activities, and 3. Socializing. There will be cooking classes, team building games, dance troupe, forums led by alumni and special guests, and much more. It'll be a memorable week and Mi Pueblo looks forward to your teen's participation in the program. Those teens entering 10th grade (called Interns) will <u>automatically</u> be enrolled in this new program. Teens entering 11th grade and 12th grade and those who graduated this year (2023) have the choice to enroll in the teen program <u>or</u> to instead work as full-time volunteers in a homeroom or class. To cover the costs of this program, there is a teen fee of \$100 for participants in the Teen Program. For teens who register to volunteer full-time, there is an adult/teen volunteer fee of \$50. The Camp fees are never sufficient to pay all the expenses of Camp, so we depend upon donations and sales of raffle tickets, and bids on the silent auction, at the Fiesta in order to provide a fun, exciting, educational, authentic and safe Camp experience. *Mi Pueblo* provides scholarships for families (and for any fees) to ensure that no one is ever turned away for lack of funds.

We are also an all-volunteer Camp, and so lots of helpers are needed – please consider volunteering---even if you can't attend during the week of Camp. We need bakers to help make and send in desserts, and sewers to help with costumes. I hope to see you soon!

Mi Pueblo Fundraising

Camp fees are never enough to cover the expenses of Mi Pueblo Camp. Also, we provide full and partial scholarships each year to ensure that no family is turned away due to an inability to pay the fees. Mi Pueblo relies on direct donations and various fundraising efforts. Mi Pueblo is operated as a 501(c)(3) non-profit, and donations are tax deductible. Concern for Children, Inc. is the non-profit parent organization of Mi Pueblo Camp. CFC has helped support the Camp since its start. Volunteers New to Mi Pueblo

All new volunteers assigned to a homeroom must have a background check and an interview. Any new volunteer not working directly with children is required to have a background check done.

Background Checks

Volunteers and Teachers working directly with children in classrooms and homerooms are required to have a background check done semi-annually. You will be contacted after registration if you need a background check.

FutureCamp Committee

The Committee is continuing its work — if you are willing to volunteer, contact Hope Carroll hopecarrollhope@gmail.com. With enrollment in the younger Camp grades falling, fewer adoptees coming into the US from Latin America, and Mi Pueblo leadership aging and their children moving on, the Planning Committee believes the Camp needs to take a serious look at the future of Mi Pueblo, with the goal of keeping the Camp going and keeping it strong.

The Future Camp Committee is chaired by Hope Carroll, and other members are Ana Burpee, Becky Parr, Carolyn Holland, and Bill Gruber.

The Committee is considering recommendations regarding how Camp is structured, whether it remains a week-long Camp or becomes a long weekend, whether more of the activities become family activities, and how we can keep the teens active and interested.

We also need to develop job descriptions and consider how to divide up jobs (including for in-town and out of town volunteers). Succession planning for leadership roles is critical as the current leaders age and/or their children are no longer involved with Camp. Our main goal is to engage former Campers and other young adult Latinos to take over key positions at Camp.
