33rd Mi Pueblo

June 16 - 20, 2025

It is time for Campers, Teens **and** ALL volunteers and instructors to register for our 33rd Mi Pueblo Day Camp which will be held the week of **June 16 to 20, 2025,** at Forest Hill Church in Cleveland Heights.

The Camp hours will be **9:30** a.m. - **4:00 p.m.**, Monday-Thursday, with early release on Friday. Friday hours are **9:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.** The annual **Fiesta** will be held on **Friday, June 20**th from **6:30-10 pm** at Forest Hill Church.

Each year we have a new theme at Camp to keep the curriculum

fresh and bring excitement to the week. This year's Camp theme is

"Drum, Dream, Dance". As the week progresses, Campers will march to the beat of their own drums as we take a harmonious journey of music and dance, and introduce the story of *Drum Dream Girl.* See p. 4 for more information about the theme, and p. 2 for information about the annual Camp Contest.

We begin on Monday with our annual opening ceremony and dive right into learning Latin American popular songs and styles. On Tuesday, Latino musical legends come alive---like Celia Cruz, Selena, Tito Puente, and others. Wednesday Campers celebrate with the music and dance of Carnival and capoeira moves. We'll also celebrate with the annual Cindy Palus Memorial Picnic in the Park. On Thursday, get ready to party with Mariachi and practice El Grito. And Friday brings stories of hope, such as Paraguay's recycled orchestra, the coquis still sing, and the girl who heard the music! We will also have our Fiesta dress rehearsal, early dismissal, and return for the annual Fiesta on Friday evening.

All campers, teen and young adult volunteers, and parent and other adult volunteers, including Teachers, MUST be registered for Camp! This year you can register online through mipueblocamp.org.

Or you can fill out the forms on the website and email or mail them in. Everyone must submit 2 forms: Registration Form, and the Information Form.

Camp fees are the same as last year. A Volunteer discount is available for parents who volunteer all 5 days at Camp. Scholarships are also available. <u>Mi Pueblo wants</u> everyone to attend and no one to be excluded due to cost.

The fees for Camp include a T-shirt, lunch, and snack each day, take home gifts, classes and special

each day. Note, that once you register for Camp, you will receive a mailing in June with

all the key information you will need for Camp.

As you fill out the forms, please consider volunteering to help plan and organize the Camp. Help is needed on **Saturday**, **June 14**th at **8:30 am** to load up the truck to carry our Camp supplies from the storage locker to the Church.

Also, we need you to help **set up Camp** on **Saturday**, **June 14**, **from 9 am to 12 noon**, **and Sunday**, **June 15**, **from 12 noon to 3 pm.** On **Sunday**, **June 15**th, **at 6 pm**, we will have our annual volunteer and Camp family get together (and pizza party) at Homewood Suites Hotel in Beachwood.

Key Facts About Mi Pueblo Culture Camp '25

<u>Camp Location</u>: Forest Hill Presbyterian Church, 3031 Monticello Blvd. (corner of Monticello Blvd. and Lee Rd.), Cleveland Hts., OH (Mi Pueblo has rented the Church's facilities for 33 years.)

Dates: Monday through Friday, June 16 - 20, 2025.

Times: 9:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. (early dismissal on Friday - hours 9:30-3:00 p.m.)

Friday Night Fiesta: June 20th - 6:30 - 10 p.m. at Forest Hill Church.

<u>Ages</u>: Camp classes are offered for children entering **Pre-school/Kindergarten** in the Fall of 2025 through those entering **9**th **grade**.

Child Care: Parents/Grandparents with children in Camp may volunteer with their child under 2.5 years of age, as long as they keep their child with them.

Pre-K: Children 2.5 years to 4 years may participate in the **Pre-K** Class as a regular Camper if the child is ready for a half day schedule of classes and activities and half day of play time. Staff will reach out to parents of these children to discuss the options.

<u>Fees</u>: Campers - \$220/child. Campers of parent volunteers - \$180/child (volunteers must hold significant pre-Camp position or work all 5 days at camp). Campers of members of Planning Committee - \$140/child. Teens in the Teen Program (See below) - \$100. Adult Volunteers \$50 if no Camper/Teen registered/\$25 if 1 or more Camper/Teen registered.

<u>Scholarships</u>: Concern for Children does not want to have any child miss the opportunity to attend camp.

Therefore, need-based scholarships are available. To apply, send a written request to Bill Gruber, 3120 Belvoir Blvd., Shaker Heights, OH 44122 or gruberwl@aol.com.

<u>Payment of Fees</u>: FEES MUST BE PAID BY JUNE 15th, BUT PLEASE SEND IN REGISTRATION FORM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. REGISTRATION FORMS SUBMITTED AFTER **MAY 31st** REQUIRE A **\$20 LATE FEE**.

Registration: You can register online and/or pay at Mi PuebloCamp.org, or you may register on the forms available at the website or in the email sent to Camp families, and you may mail in a check if preferred. You will receive more Camp details in early June. Refunds of 100% will be made no later than May 31st, 50% no later than June 15th, 25% no later than June 20th. NO CAMPER REGISTRATIONS ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 7th. FORMS SUBMITTED AFTER MAY 31st REQUIRE A LATE FEE OF \$20. PAYMENT MAY BE MADE BY JUNE 15th.

<u>Teen Program:</u> The goal of the program, in its 3rd year, is to balance the work and fun of Camp. The Teen Program will include: 1. Volunteering, 2. Organized activities, and 3. Socializing. There will be cooking classes, team building games, dance, a forum led by alumni and special guests, and much more. **Teens entering 10th grade will** <u>automatically</u> be enrolled in this new program. Teens entering 11th and 12th grade and those who graduated this year (2025) have the choice to enroll in the teen program <u>or</u> to instead work as full-time volunteers in a homeroom or class. To cover the costs of this program, there is a fee of \$100 for participants. For teens who register to volunteer full-time, there is an adult/teen volunteer fee of \$50. Volunteers and Teachers working directly with children in classrooms and homerooms are required to have a background check done semi-annually. You will be contacted after registration if you need a background check. All new volunteers assigned to a homeroom must have a background check and an interview.

Come to Camp the weekend before Camp to help get ready — children are welcome.
